

change its constitution and by-laws without the approval of the Faculty, provided such changes do not involve any extension of the powers of the Association beyond the matters above enumerated.

If, in order to secure efficient government in the above respects, the Association shall deem it advisable to prescribe penalties, such penalties, in so far as they affect the student's connection with the college or her business relations with it, shall be valid only when approved by the president of the college.

The Students' Association is expected to keep the Faculty fully informed as to its constitution, by-laws, rules, and its action in all matters of student government.

The Faculty reserves the right to revoke this grant of power or any part of it at any time.

CONSTITUTION.

ARTICLE I.

Name.

The name of this organization shall be the Students' Association of Vassar College.

ARTICLE II.

Object.

The object of this Association shall be to enact and enforce laws in accordance with the charter granted to the Association by the Faculty of Vassar College, to transact business pertaining to the whole body of students, and to further the interest of the students so far as it lies within its power.

ARTICLE III.

Members.

All undergraduates of Vassar College may become members of the Association upon reading and signing its Constitution and By-laws. All
