She looked polite and puzzled so I hastened to add that I was Jean MacCoy's sister. The

magic word changed everything; she shook hands all over again, she and Miss [Babson] got into the perennially interesting discussion of how much I looked like Jean, and Louise Holmquist sent her love to Jean. Some are born great, some achieve greatness, and some have sisters thrust upon them!

Last night we had a Students' Meeting that was awfully interesting, although about every other subject was referred to the Joint Committee!

Friday night we had the most wonderful concert by Dr. Ludwig [Wellever]. He

gave a recital of German songs.
