We're sitting comfortably at the seaside and listening to the rolling of the ocean waves and are devouring our way, by the sweat of our brows, etc., through provisions that gentle hands have far too copiously stocked for us. The checks that have arrived up to now (about 1,350 dollars) came from Mr. Matz. We intend to cash them when the rest has arrived, or else right away and send a check to the Genevan committee.
