He has seen to assisting exiled German intellectuals with more dedication than any other man I know. He did it silently and under difficult conditions. As he is also well informed about the general political situation, I consider it desirable and justified if you were to grant him some of your very valuable time for a conversation.

Rabbi Wise told me about the recent meeting at your place. I felt glad and proud that in America the Jewish destiny lies in the hands of such strong and prudent personalities. How important it would have been if that had also been the case in Germany in recent years.
