Here all's well so far, except that I'm breaking my last few teeth on cracking those computations. But it's at least worth the effort! No news from Zurich. Albert applied for an extension to the deadline for a decision regarding acceptance of the inheritance.

I'm very much looking forward to seeing you again, hopefully not always for such a short time. I feel with pain that circumstances force me to add constantly to your worries. Lazarus just barely escaped danger when a crashing airplane exploded right in front of his country home.
