Dear Professor Einstein,

I send you enclosed the draft letter by Attorney Maass, which is addressed to Attorney Guggenheim. As no ship is sailing before Tuesday, I thought it right that you see the draft and sign it yourself. I made just one small modification, which I marked with a cross in the margin, because, to my knowledge, up to now Mrs. Mileva Einstein's creditors have not yet attached the income from the Hutten Street building.
